Focus:

Our theme of 'Face to Face' was purposefully underscored and advanced throughout the whole day. For active and busy leaders reinforcing the core theme was appreciated.

Our key note speaker, Paul Johansen provided rich and nourishing food for thought about our Face to Face time with God. The intentionality of the 'Living Water' exercise, rich in the symbolism of the empty water jar, coupled with times of personal reflection provided opportunities for meaningful face to face encounters with God. The carefully and passionately presented material related to marriage was thought provoking and practical. The round table discussions about difficult face to face conversations in ministry were filled with honesty, realistic solutions and collective wisdom interspersed with a lot of laughter.

Eager:

The church leaders who were present showed an eagerness to engage, to listen, and to learn how to experience more fully 'face to face' time with God and others.

Preparation:

The level of preparation and planning to ensure the day was meaningful for all who attended was evident. People appreciated attention to details, from the conference folder and literature provided, to the great coffee and ceramic 'water jar' take away.

Gratitude:

People who attended greatly appreciated the opportunity to step away from the often frantic pace of daily ministry to engage in lively discussions and dialogue with other church leaders. People felt cared for...body, soul, and spirit.

Unfinished Business Groups

Unfinished Business groups provide a safe place to process some of life's experiences and ministry challenges that have caused wounding in the lives of Christian leaders.

Each spring and fall a small group of Christian leaders spend fourteen evenings learning, praying together and experiencing God's healing touch in their lives. The group provides a Christ-centered journey that helps participants look at dysfunctional behaviors, emotional upheaval, and false beliefs and lovingly ease emotional and spiritual wounds. "Freedom" is the word most often used in describing the fruit that people experience in their lives after attending a series.

We are excited to announce that a monthly follow up group is now available for anyone who has attended an Unfinished Business group or has received on-on-one coaching. These groups are held the first Monday of each month.
